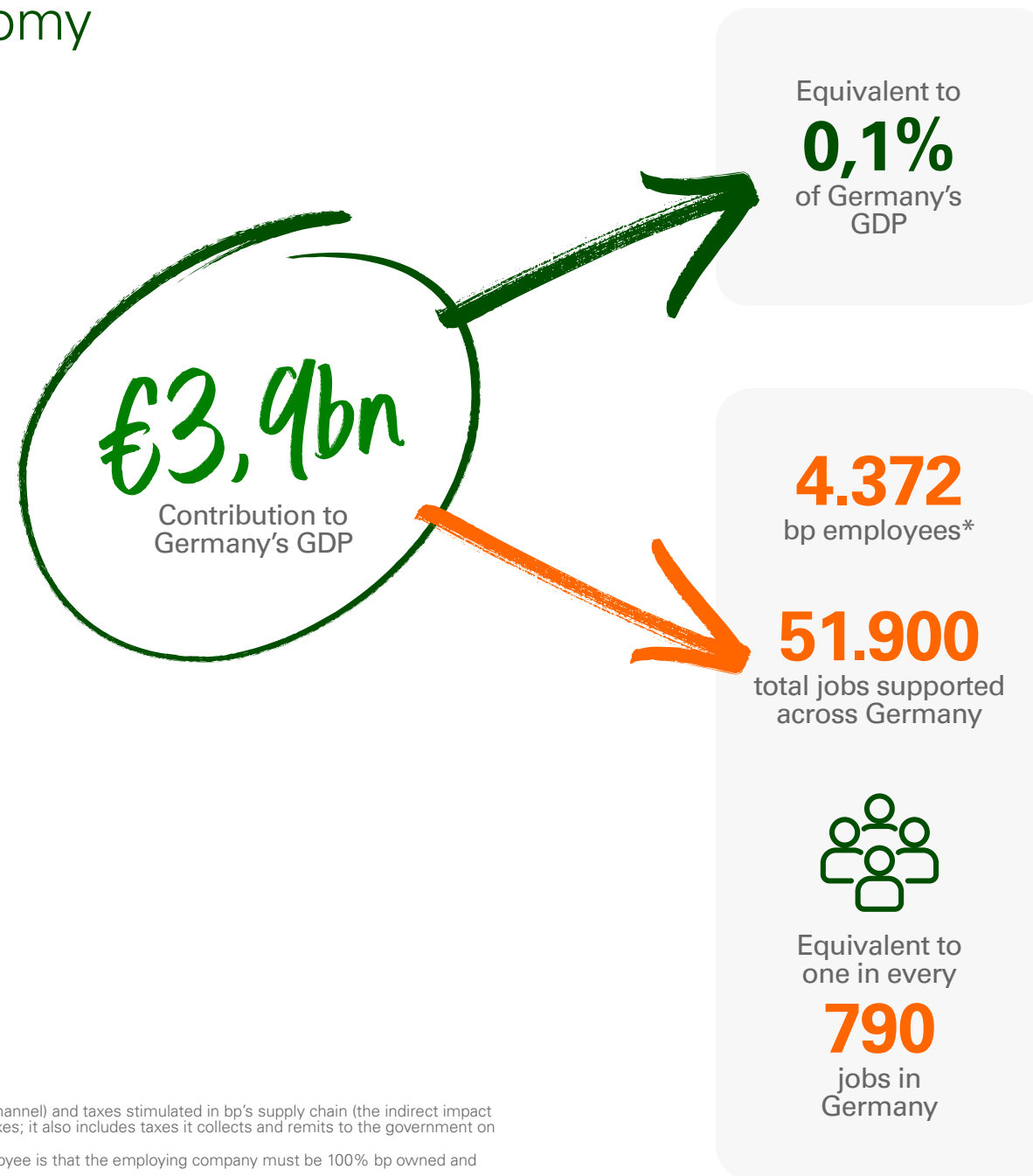
Total impact

At a glance – bp’s 2022 contribution to the German economy

bp makes important contributions to Germany’s economy

In total, bp supported **€3,9 billion** in gross value added contributions to Germany’s GDP – equivalent to **0,1%** of German GDP.

- bp’s own operations directly created a **€505 million** gross value added contribution.
- bp was directly responsible for **4.372 jobs**, and stimulated a further **47.500 jobs** along Germany’s supply chain.
- bp spent a total of **€3,9 billion** with German suppliers.
- bp supported a tax contribution to Germany’s government of **€11 billion**. Through its direct operations bp collected and paid **€8,7 billion** in tax revenue to the government and also supported **€2,1 billion** worth of tax contributions along the supply chain.

bp's tax contribution is split into two parts: taxes paid and collected by bp (the direct impact channel) and taxes stimulated in bp's supply chain (the indirect impact channel). Taxes paid and collected by bp include the taxes bp pays itself, for example corporate taxes; it also includes taxes it collects and remits to the government on behalf of others, such as VAT and labour taxes.

*Number of bp employees as at 31st December, 2022: Criteria required to be counted as employee is that the employing company must be 100% bp owned and submit consolidated accounts centrally through bp.

Direct impact

bp's operations directly benefit Germany's economy

bp directly contributes significantly to Germany's economy through its wide range of operations, including production of fuels and petrochemicals in the second largest refinery system in Germany with refineries in Gelsenkirchen and Lingen.

Additionally, Aral is the largest retail site provider in Germany, the most important European retail market with around 2,400 sites and an attractive convenience offer for on-the-go supply. Its e-mobility brand Aral pulse is also one of the largest providers of publicly accessible ultra-fast charging stations in Germany. Castrol manufactures and sells lubricants in Germany for the automotive and industrial purposes. For aviation the company provides aviation fuels – including SAF – by Air bp.

In 2022, bp directly:

- generated a **€505 million** gross value added contribution to Germany's GDP.
- was responsible for **4.372 jobs**.
- paid and collected **€8,7 billion** in tax for the government.

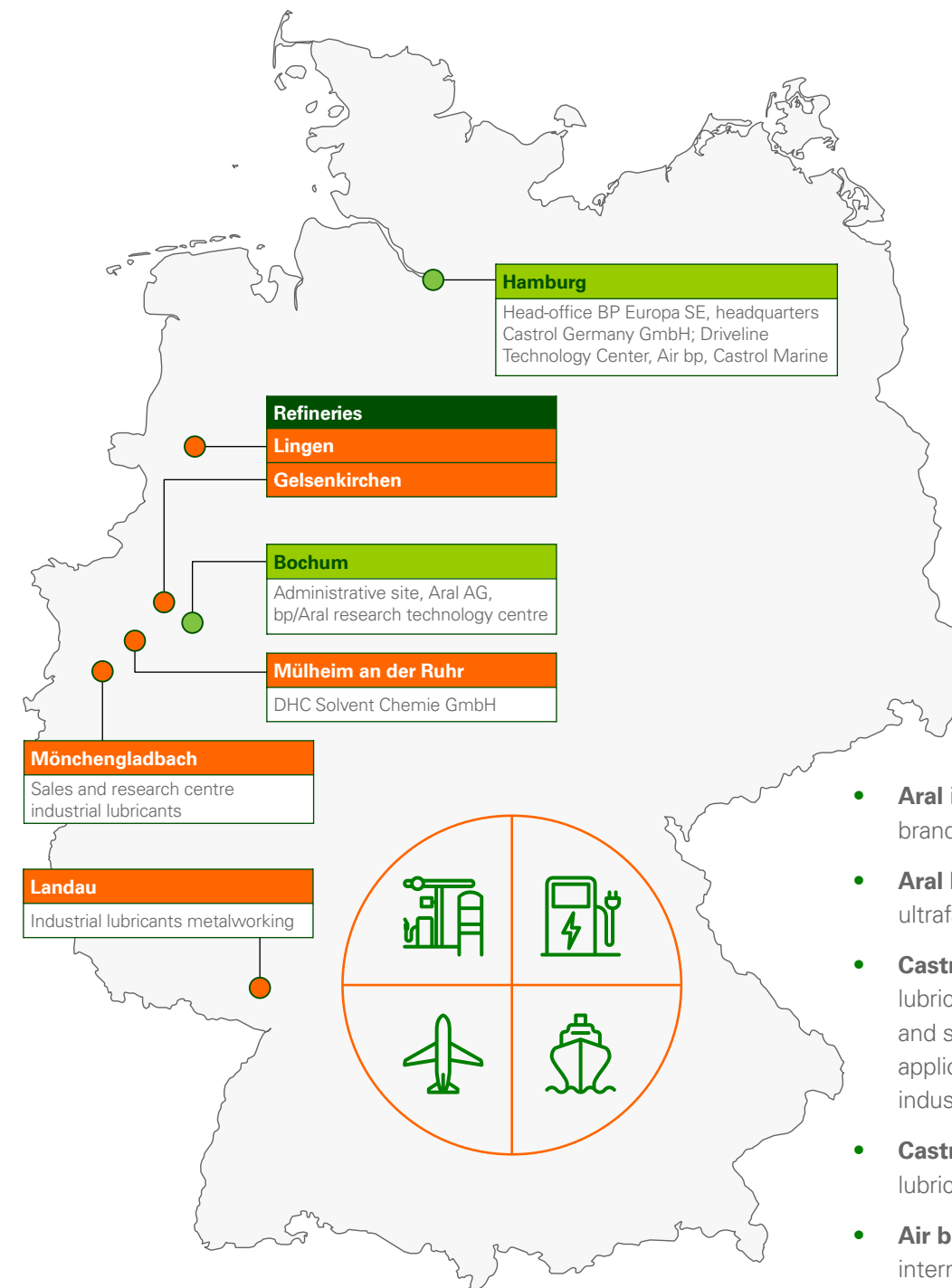


Fig. 1. bp's direct activities in Germany, 2022

- **Aral** is Germany's largest forecourt brand
- **Aral Pulse** is one of the leading ultrafast charging brands in Germany
- **Castrol** is one of the world's leading lubricants brands, offering products and services for all areas of application in the automotive and industrial sectors
- **Castrol Marine** provides shipping lubricants
- **Air bp** supplies aviation fuel to major international airports as well as smaller airfields

Indirect impact

bp's spending with German suppliers stimulates substantial economic activity

By buying goods and services from its suppliers, bp supports gross value added, jobs, and tax impacts along the supply chain.

bp spent a total of **€3,9 billion** with German businesses in 2022. This procurement spending supported an estimated:

- **€3,4 billion** in gross value added contributions to GDP along the supply chain.
- **47,500 jobs** in the supply chain.
- **€2,1 billion** in tax revenues along the supply chain.

bp's supply chain spending benefitted a wide range of businesses and sectors

A wide variety of German businesses benefitted from bp's operational spend of **€3,6 billion** in 2022.

- Businesses in the food and beverages industry benefitted the most from this operational expenditure, as they received **€1,0 billion**, accounting for **29%** of total.
- Transportation and storage businesses were also significant recipients of bp's operational spending, receiving **€514 million**, or **14%** of the total.

This spending, along with bp's supply chain spending elsewhere in the world, supported and estimated:

- **€3,0 billion** gross value added contribution to the German GDP.
- **42,800 jobs**.
- **€1,9 billion** in tax revenue.

Operational spend (€ millions) 2022

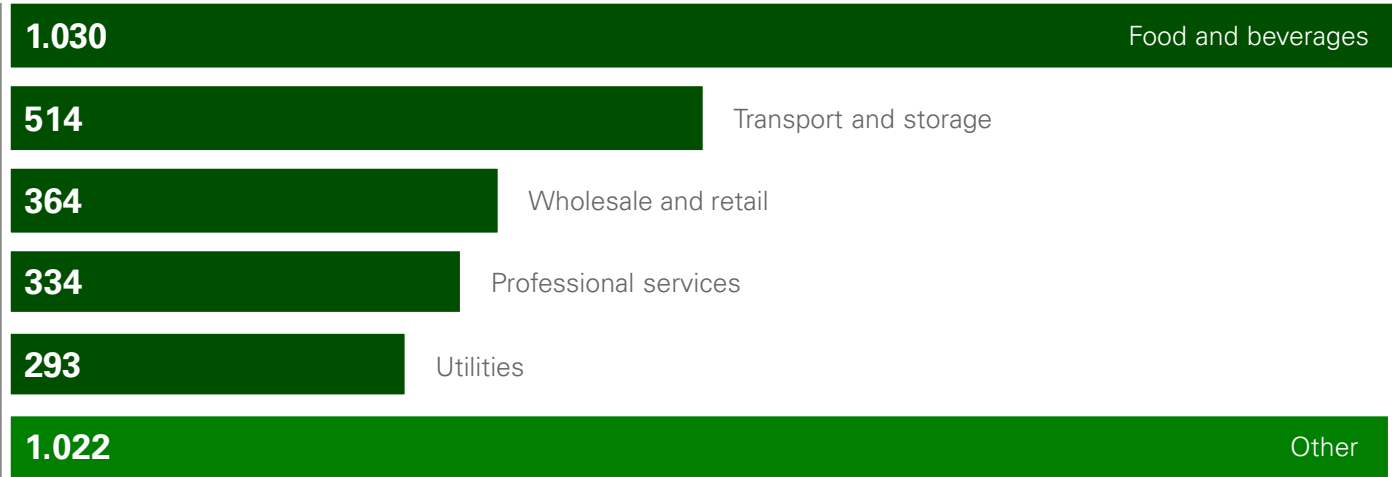


Fig. 2. bp's operational spend in Germany, 2022

bp also supports a wide range of businesses through its capital expenditure

Capital spend on German suppliers by bp was **€365 million** in 2022.

- The professional and business services sector received **24%** of bp’s total capital expenditure

This spending, along with bp’s spending elsewhere in the world, supported an estimated:

- **€340 million** in gross value added contribution to Germany’s GDP.
- **4.700 jobs**.
- **€210 million** in tax revenue.

Capital spend (€ millions) 2022

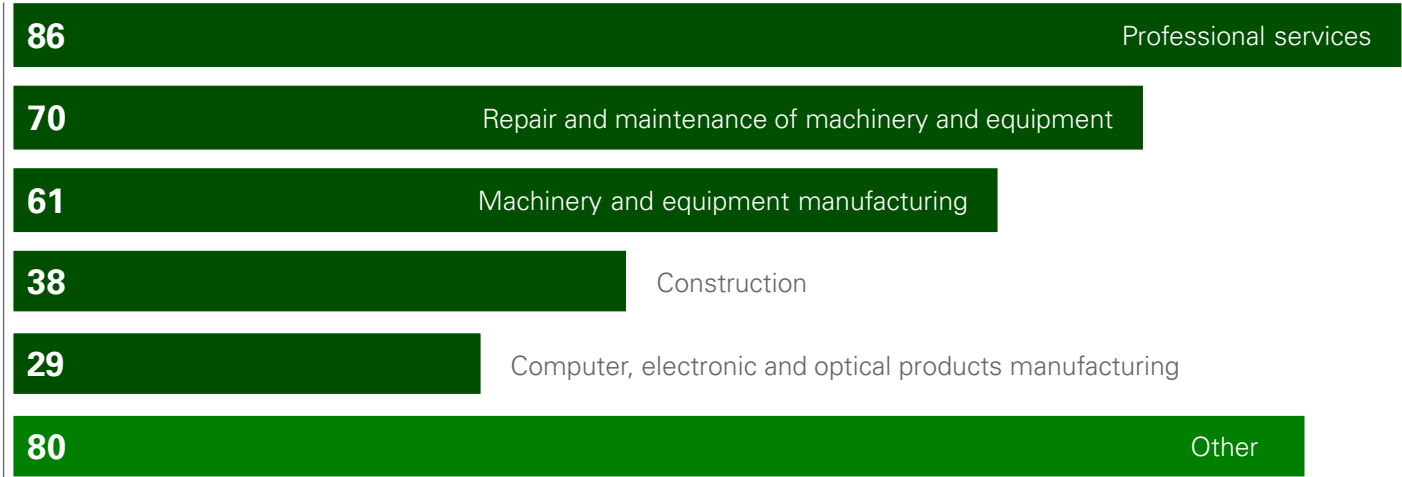


Fig. 3. bp’s capital spend in Germany, 2022

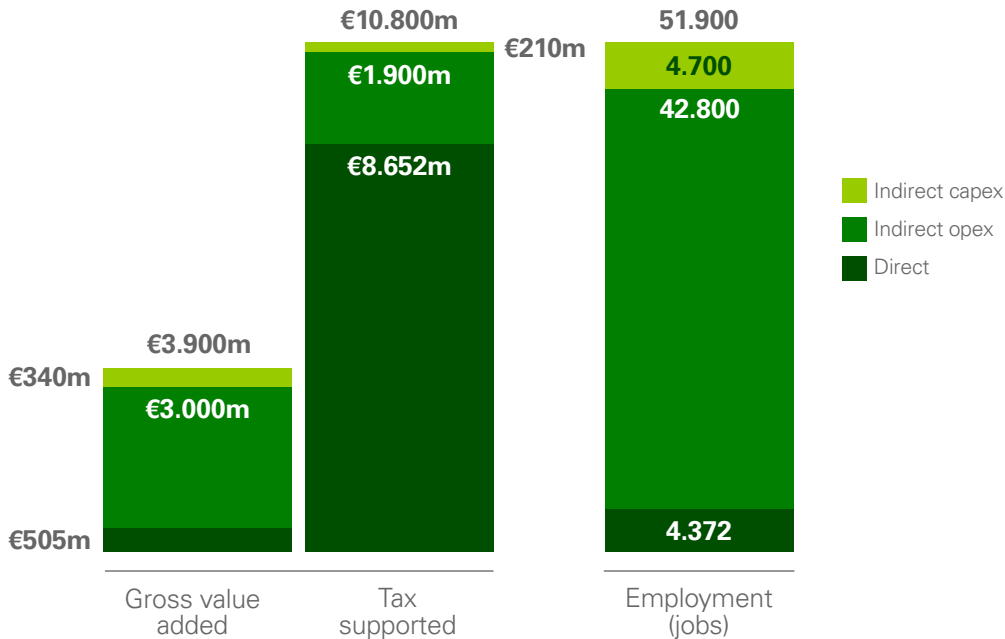

Total impact

bp’s total impact in Germany in 2022 was substantial

- For every euro of gross value added bp itself created, the company supported a further **€6,60** in the supply chain.
- For every job at bp itself, the firm supported a further **11 jobs** across Germany.
- For every euro bp itself paid and collected, the company supported a further **€0,25** in tax in the supply chain.
