In Azerbaijan, BP currently has more than 2550 Azerbaijani national employees including:

- 500 female national employees;
- 200 mid- and senior level female leaders;
- 210 Azerbaijani nationals who have been on international assignments abroad since 2013;
- 55 nationals who are currently on international assignments;
- 300 Challengers recruited since 2013 BP's Challenge programme attracts talented graduates and develops their technical skills.
- 300 nationals who have received education support since 2013 -BP helps its national staff receive higher education in Western universities.

BP also encourages its contractors to maximise national workforce involvement - at peak, Shah Deniz 2 and SCPX projects involved over 24,000 people in Azerbaijan, the majority of them were Azerbaijani nationals.
