



## **TANGGUH COORDINATION WITH POLICE DURING YEAR 2009**

The Integrated Community Based Security (ICBS) program was designed with the goal of providing those who live and work around Tangguh LNG with a safe and secure environment. It was formulated in collaboration with the Indonesian authorities to address the security and human rights concerns of all stakeholders based on partnerships between Tangguh, the communities, and the government's security providers. As such, on April 16, 2004, a Security "Field" Guidelines Agreement was executed between the Papua police and BP, as operator of Tangguh LNG<sup>1</sup>. The Field Guidelines set forth the measures to implement the broader Memorandum of Understanding dated August 22, 2003 between BPMIGAS (Indonesia's upstream oil & gas regulatory body) and the Indonesian police concerning security of oil and gas projects throughout the Republic of Indonesia.

The Field Guidelines are aimed at ensuring that the working conditions at Tangguh LNG remain secure, in order, and without violation of law. They cover the provision of security at the project and at associated project facilities. The Field Guidelines make clear that BP is responsible for primary security provided by unarmed private security guards. The Guidelines also specify the procedures to be followed whereby BP can request assistance from the police, and the procedures to be followed by the police in deploying such assistance.

The Field Guidelines describe specific commitments of both BP and the police with respect to bearing the costs of security for Tangguh. In this regard:

- Each respective organization will bear its own cost for the conduct of its activities or the discharge of its basic obligations under the Guidelines.
- All costs, payments, and provisions of materials or supplies will be open and transparent and either side has the discretion to publicly disclose this information.
- If BP requests security assistance from the police:
  - With BP approval and request for payment, BPMIGAS (the Indonesia upstream oil & gas regulatory body) will make payment for transportation, lodging, meals, and daily allowances.

- The amount and procedure for payment will be based on standards and procedures issued by BPMIGAS.
- BP will not be obligated to pay for any support unless previously approved and accepted by BPMIGAS as 'cost recoverable' based on the applicable production sharing contracts and approved by BP Management and its investment partners in the Tangguh project BP will not be allowed and will not provide any weapon, weaponry, ammunition or any funding to support the procurement of these items.

### **Payments in 2009 in Direct Support of Tangguh Security**

In 2009, several activities in regard to ICBS and Joint Security Guideline were conducted. Most of the activities were milestones to the ICBS program, such as (1) Joint Exercise BP and Police; (2) Voluntary Principles on Security and Human Rights (VPSHR) In House Training (IHT) for both Public Security Forces and BP Security; (3) Joint Marine Patrol BP and Bintuni Marine Police; (4) Signing of JUKLAP Amendment, and; (5) Security Forum in two Regencies (Bintuni and Fakfak).

### **Background of Activities**

**Joint Exercise BP and Police 2009 :** The 2<sup>nd</sup> joint exercise between the security guards of the Tangguh LNG Project and the local security authorities, was conducted at the BP Tangguh LNG site. This exercise was attended by 150 policemen, 30 security guards and 140 Tangguh workers, with tens of supporting groups, including members of the local military, local government, and support from local NGOs. The training was also observed by the Police HQ, the regional military commander and officials from BPMIGAS Jakarta. This field exercise was part of five-day activity that included three days of class training and one day devoted to table-top exercises.

The purpose of these exercises was to apply the Joint Security Field Guidelines signed by the Tangguh and Papuan police regarding security provisions for the project and to apply the Voluntary Principles of Security and Human Rights. The exercise training included the following:

- Civil Disturbance Management



- Negotiation Skills
- First Aid
- Evacuation Procedures

**VPSHR IHT for both Public Security Forces and BP Security:** To follow up on the VPSHR Training of Trainers program, trained participants of the program conducted in-house training on VPSHR to their fellow security personnel within and surrounding Tangguh LNG. Several trainings were held in several locations with different participants; Police in Manokwari, Bintuni, Fakfak, and Babo; Army Platoon in Bintuni, and; BP Security in the LNG Site and Babo.

**Joint Marine Patrol BP and Bintuni Marine Police:** To follow up on the Exclusion Zone (EZ) program, BP Security supported by Bintuni Marine Police conducted Joint Marine Patrol in the EZ area to prevent violation by community trespassers, to further familiarize the restricted area to all fishermen, and to monitor the level of awareness among fishermen around Tangguh LNG.

**Signing of JUKLAP Amendment:** An amendment of the Joint Security Guideline (JUKLAP) was signed by BP Indonesia Head of Country and the Papua Chief of Police (Kapolda) in August 2009. The document extended the JUKLAP signed in 2004 between the Executive Tangguh Project and Kapolda, which had ended in 2009.

**Security Forum in two Regencies (Bintuni and Fakfak) :** This forum was meant to establish awareness and communication among community leaders, public security forces, and local government on the issue of security i.e. alcohol abuse, felony crime, immigration etc, which influence their daily lives. In 2009 there were two security forums conducted in the Bintuni and Fakfak Regencies.

A summary breakdown of payments is listed in the table below:
