



## TANGGUH COORDINATION WITH POLICE DURING YEAR 2010

The Integrated Community Based Security (ICBS) program was designed with the goal of providing those who live and work around Tangguh LNG with a safe and secure environment. It was formulated in collaboration with the Indonesian authorities to address the security and human rights concerns of all stakeholders based on partnerships between Tangguh, the communities, and the government's security providers. As such, on April 16, 2004, a Security "Field" Guidelines Agreement was executed between the Papua police and BP, as operator of Tangguh LNG<sup>1</sup>. The Field Guidelines set forth the measures to implement the broader Memorandum of understanding dated August 22, 2003 between BPMIGAS (Indonesia's upstream oil & gas regulatory body) and the Indonesian police concerning security of oil and gas projects throughout the Republic of Indonesia. This field Security Guidelines Agreement is valid for 5 (five) years and has been renewed on August 6, 2009.

The Field Guidelines make clear that BP is responsible for primary security provided by unarmed private security guards at the Tangguh operations and at associated operations facilities. The Guidelines also specify the procedures to be followed whereby BP can request assistance from the police, and the procedures to be followed by the police in deploying such assistance.

The Field Guidelines describe specific commitments of both BP and the police with respect to bearing the costs of security for Tangguh. In this regard:

- Each respective organization will bear its own cost for the conduct of its activities or the discharge of its basic obligations under the Guidelines.
- All costs, payments, and provisions of materials or supplies will be open and transparent and either side has the discretion to publicly disclose this information.
- If BP requests security assistance from the police:
  - With BP approval and request for payment, BPMIGAS (the Indonesia upstream oil & gas regulatory body) will make payment for transportation, lodging, meals, and daily allowances.
  - The amount and procedure for payment will be based on standards and procedures issued by BPMIGAS.
  - BP will not be obligated to pay for any support unless previously approved and accepted by BPMIGAS as 'cost recoverable' based on the applicable production sharing contracts and approved by BP Management and its investment partners in the Tangguh project BP will not be allowed and will not provide any weapon, weaponry, ammunition or any funding to support the procurement of these items.

### Payments in 2010 in Direct Support of Tangguh Security

In 2010, several activities in regard to ICBS and Security operations were conducted. Most of the activities were milestones in the ICBS program, such as (1) Bomb wreckage handling; (2) Community blockade handling; (3) Joint Marine Patrol; (4) Evacuation of BP team from Weriagar village; (5) Mass demonstration handling; (6) Joint exercise BP and Police, which includes coordination meeting; (7) Voluntary Principles on Security and Human Rights (VPSHR) In House Training (IHT) for both Public Security Forces and BP Security; and (8) Regular coordination meeting with Bintuni and Fakfak police.

### Background of Activities

**Bomb handling:** BP security requested the support from local police to identify, escort and conduct further handling of materials suspected to be a WW II bomb which was discovered at the Babo airstrip in July. Coordination and escort was conducted by Babo Police, while identification and handling was managed by Sorong Police.

**Police assistance to handle community blockade:** BP security requested the assistance of Babo Police to manage a blockade conducted by the community at the Babo airstrip in July. Demonstrators demanded the local government to pay compensation for the land used for the Babo airport. The issue was not directly related to BP but the company needed to secure its assets located at the airport, as well as secure crew change activities.

**Joint patrol between BP Security and Bintuni Police:** Following up on the Exclusion Zone (EZ) program, BP Security together with Bintuni Marine Police conducted a Joint Marine Patrol in the EZ area from 1 Oct – 31 Dec to prevent violations by community trespassers. The joint patrol also serves to further remind fishermen of the restriction and to monitor the level of awareness among fishermen around Tangguh LNG.

**Evacuation of BP team from Wiriagar village:** High political tension post the regental election in October forced BP to evacuate a team of three BP employees and three consultants from Weriagar village to the LNG Site. Members of the community had resorted to violence and BP's Pos Inap in the village was blockaded. BP Security requested emergency action to the Aranday Sector Police to evacuate the team using BP's chartered boat.

**Babo Police assistance to handle and secure mass demonstration:** BP security required the assistance of the Babo Police to manage and to secure a mass demonstration in October. Demonstrators had gathered to protest a BP contractor regarding its recruitment process. The demonstrators also detained 16 new contractor employees in Babo.



**Coordination meeting with Polda Papua and Police Headquarters to prepare for the Joint Exercise:** Two coordination meetings with Police to prepare for the Joint Exercise program were conducted, both in November; first at the BP Office in Jakarta and second in Jayapura. These meetings were held to develop and finalize the scenarios of the joint exercise, including all technical aspects.

**Joint exercise on Security Guidelines (Juklap Pambers) with Bintuni and Papua Police:** The 3rd joint exercise between the security guards of the Tangguh LNG Project and the local security authorities was conducted at Tangguh LNG site on 3-9 December. This exercise was attended by 160 policemen, 30 security guards and 140 Tangguh workers, with tens of supporting groups, including members of the local military, local government, and support from local NGOs and media. The training was also observed by the Police HQ, the regional military commander and officials from BPMIGAS Jakarta. This field exercise was part of five-day activity that included three days of class training and one day devoted to table-top exercises.

The purpose of these exercises was to apply the Joint Security Field Guidelines signed by the Tangguh and Papuan police regarding security provisions for the project and to apply the Voluntary Principles of Security and Human Rights. The exercise training included the following:

- Civil Disturbance Management
- Negotiation Skills
- First Aid
- Evacuation Procedures

**Voluntary Principles of Security and Human Rights (VPSHR) in-house training (IHT):** To follow up on the VPSHR Training of Trainers program, graduates of the program in-turn conducted an in-house training in December to their fellow security personnel within and surrounding Tangguh LNG. The trainings were held in Army Platoon Base in Bintuni.

**Regular coordination meeting with Bintuni and Fakfak Police:** In line with the Papua Police Chief – BP Indonesia Head of Country decision in 6 August 2009, during the operational phase of Tangguh LNG, regular coordination meetings were held in November and December, in Bintuni and Fakfak. The meetings include several agenda such as update on Tangguh LNG operations, potential security issues in Tangguh, security community-based program (ICBS), predictions on security issues in Bintuni. The coordination meeting has been scheduled to be organized at least once a year to secure support from Police in securing Tangguh LNG.

A summary breakdown of payments is listed in the table below:
