



TANGGUH COORDINATION WITH POLICE DURING YEAR 2012

The Integrated Community Based Security (ICBS) program was designed with the goal of providing those who live and work around Tangguh LNG with a safe and secure environment. It was formulated in collaboration with the Indonesian authorities to address the security and human rights concerns of all stakeholders based on partnerships between Tangguh, the communities, and the government's security providers. As such, on April 16, 2004, a Security "Field" Guidelines Agreement was executed between the Papua police and BP, as operator of Tangguh LNG¹. The Field Guidelines set forth the measures to implement the broader Memorandum of understanding dated August 22, 2003 between BPMIGAS (Indonesia's upstream oil & gas regulatory body) and the Indonesian police concerning security of oil and gas projects throughout the Republic of Indonesia. This field Security Guidelines Agreement is worth for 5 (five) years and has been renewed on August 6, 2009.

The Field Guidelines are aimed at ensuring that the working conditions at Tangguh LNG remain secure, in order, and without violation of law. They cover the provision of security at the project and at associated project facilities. The Field Guidelines make clear that BP is responsible for primary security provided by unarmed private security guards. The Guidelines also specify the procedures to be followed whereby BP can request assistance from the police, and the procedures to be followed by the police in deploying such assistance.

The Field Guidelines describe specific commitments of both BP and the police with respect to bearing the costs of security for Tangguh. In this regard:

- Each respective organization will bear its own cost for the conduct of its activities or the discharge of its basic obligations under the Guidelines.
- All costs, payments, and provisions of materials or supplies will be open and transparent and either side has the discretion to publicly disclose this information.
- If BP requests security assistance from the police:
 - With BP approval and request for payment, BPMIGAS (the Indonesia upstream oil & gas regulatory body) will make payment for transportation, lodging, meals, and daily allowances.
 - The amount and procedure for payment will be based on standards and procedures issued by BPMIGAS.
 - BP will not be obligated to pay for any support unless previously approved and accepted by BPMIGAS as 'cost recoverable' based on the applicable production sharing contracts and approved by BP Management and its investment partners in the Tangguh project BP will not be allowed and will not provide any weapon, weaponry, ammunition or any funding to support the procurement of these items.

Payments in 2012 in Direct Support of Tangguh Security

In 2012, several activities in regard to ICBS and Security operations were conducted as below:

- 1. Regular coordination meeting with Bintuni and Fakfak Police:** This meeting is one of the routine activities carried out regularly (annual basis) that the support of the necessary security forces to provide security guarantees for the continuation of activities at BP's Tangguh LNG refer to Security guidelines book.
- 2. Coordination meetings for planned Joint Exercise event:** a series of meetings held in preparation of the Joint Exercise program on Security Guidelines (Juklap Pambers) with Bintuni and Papua Police.
- 3. Familiarization of Security Guidelines to police at Bintuni, Babo, Aranday, Kokas and Manokwari:** To familiarize Police officials with the Security Guidelines, so they could understand their function and act properly as per agreed guidance.
- 4. National Intelligence Agency (BIN) visit to Tangguh LNG:** To conduct four days LNG site visit to ensure proper security mechanisms and implementation as per National Vital Object requirement.
- 5. Voluntary Principles of Security and Human Rights (VPSHR) in-house training (IHT):** To follow up on the VPSHR Training of Trainers program, trained participants of the program conducted in-house training on VPSHR to their fellow security personnel within and surrounding Tangguh LNG. The trainings were held in Kompi Senapan E/752 Bintuni, Babo Police, Fakfak Police, Bintuni Police and Sub Den 3 Detasemen C Sat Brimob Manokwari.
- 6. Joint security patrol between BP Security and Bintuni Police.** To perform joint patrol with Police to secure exclusion zone against any intrusion and reduce trespassing entering exclusion zone and land of LNG Site perimeter
- 7. Joint socialization on exclusion zone to communities in 5 villages:** socialization on the importance and boundaries of the exclusion zone to communities in Tanah Merah Baru, Saengga, Onar Lama, Onar Baru and Sidomakmur.
- 8. Joint Exercise on Security Guidelines (Juklap Pambers) with Bintuni and Papua Police:** the Joint Exercise activity was conducted on 19-23 November 2012 at Tangguh LNG and Babo basecamp.



- 9. Community Policing workshop at Tanah Merah Baru and Saengga:** To equip community policing committee with understanding of their scopes, knowledge, roles and responsibility as community policing in the purpose to secure LNG project as National Vital Object.
- 10. Joint Exercise evaluation with Papua Police:** evaluation of the Joint Exercise activity to record lessons learned and suggests improvements for future exercises.
- 11. Police assistance to handle detainment of BP charter boat by local community:** BP security requested police assistance to help release BP's charter boat detained by members of the local community at Weriar Jetty.
