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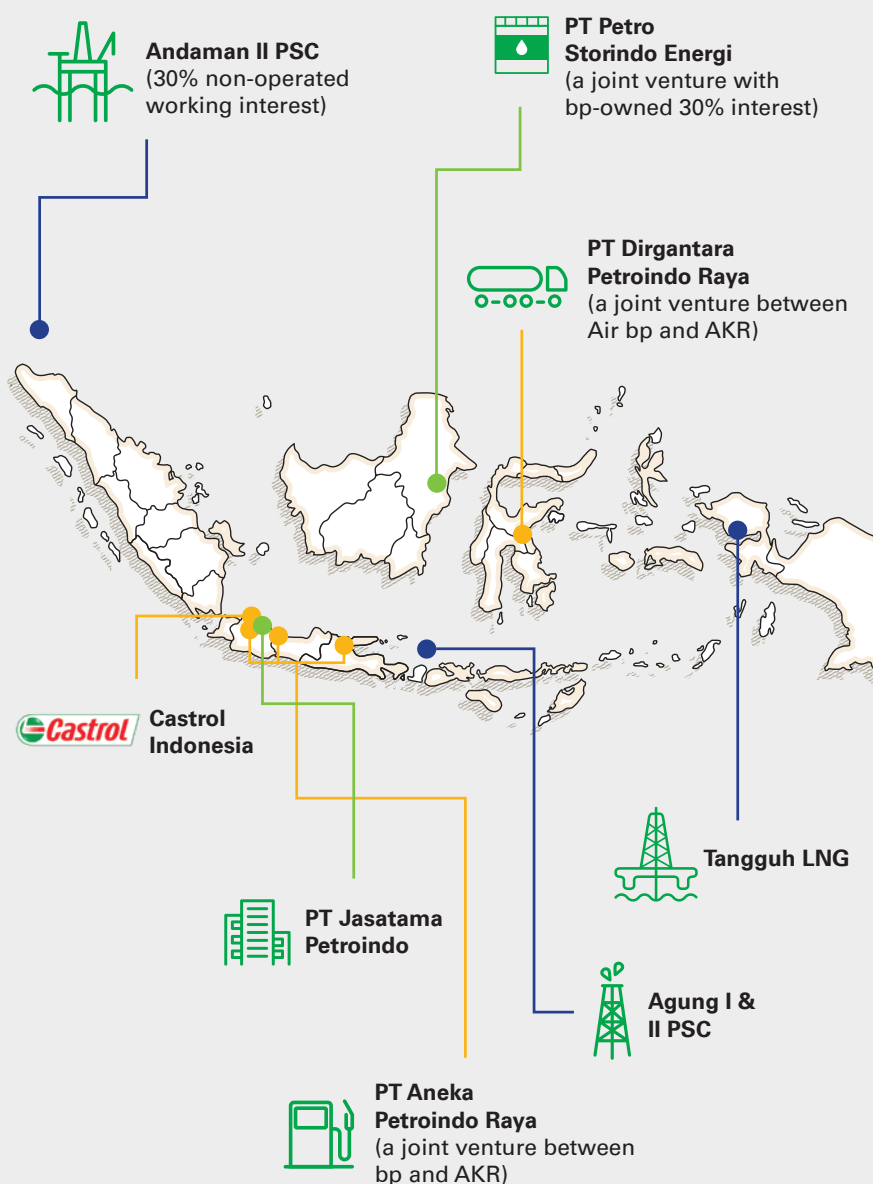

# PT Aneka Petroindo Raya

Since beginning operations in 2018, we have opened 34 service stations across Greater Jakarta and East Java area. Our aim is to open up to 350 fuel stations in Indonesia over the next decade.

Our fuels service stations in Indonesia are fitted out with the goal of reducing their carbon footprint, supported by bp Target Neutral. We are a partner of the BIRU project that enables households to produce their own low-cost, low-carbon energy using biogas digesters thus saving Indonesia an estimated 45,000 tonnes of CO<sup>2</sup> emissions per year.

We are committed to developing and offering a differentiated consumer proposition that leverages both bp and AKR's capabilities and expertise across Indonesia's growing fuels retail market.

## PT Dirgantara Petroindo Raya

Air bp and AKR see huge potential within the Indonesian aviation fuel sector and will support the development of Indonesia's aviation industry. Our joint venture holds the remit to develop aviation fuel business in Indonesia.

We are the jet fuel supplier for Wiladatika Private Airport in Jakarta, and we operate a jet fuel storage and provide into plane filling service at the Indonesian Morowali Industrial Park, Sulawesi Tengah.

## PT Jasatama Petroindo

PT Jasatama Petroindo is bp's trading & shipping arm in the country. PT Jasatama Petroindo has extensive experience in trading gas oil for mining and industrial purposes, as well as fuel oil for Marine Vessel Power Plants. We have been operating in Indonesia's gas oil market since 2010, and expanded our portfolio to the limited trading of fuel oil in 2018.

In support of a just energy transition, we help the next generation of Indonesians advance their education. For over five years, PT Jasatama Petroindo has been providing scholarships to university students in the country, focusing on engineering and economics.



## PT Petro Storindo Energi

PT Petro Storindo Energi is a tank terminal company which was developed to meet the rising demand for diesel fuel, in the expanding coal mining operations in Kalimantan Timur. It operates a 75,000 m<sup>3</sup> storage terminal along with a dolphin mooring system, located in Sangatta, Kalimantan Timur.



# Tangguh LNG

bp has been operating Tangguh LNG since 2009. Located in Teluk Bintuni, Papua Barat province it is a fully integrated LNG operations – from bringing gas from the bay, to processing it in our two-train onshore liquefaction facility, and delivering the LNG to customers.

We are currently working to expand the Tangguh LNG plant by adding a third train, which will increase Tangguh's production capacity to a total of 11.4 million tonnes per annum (mtpa). Tangguh train 3 was deemed a National Strategic Project, as per Presidential Decree No. 58/2017.

More than 99% of our team is in Indonesian, with more than half of our people being local Papuans.



# Reimagining Indonesia's energy

## **The Ubadari and Vorwata Carbon Capture Utilization and Storage (CCUS)**

It will remove up to 90% of the reservoir-associated CO<sup>2</sup> which is currently vented and represents nearly half of the Tangguh LNG emissions.

## **Blok Andaman II**

30% non-operating interest for Blok Andaman II, 150 km offshore Aceh with Harbour Energy.

## **Agung I and II exploration blocks**

In 2022, bp has also signed a 30-year Production Sharing Contracts (PSC) for Agung I and Agung II exploration blocks in offshore Bali, East Java and South Sulawesi with the government of Indonesia.
