bpTT-MIC apprentices learn about solar

In May the bpTT/MIC apprentices were among the MIC students who received an overview of Trinidad and Tobago's first utility scale solar project.

The Brechin Castle Solar Farm is progressing with start up expected by the end of 2025. The project is a joint venture between bp, Shell and NGC.

The project update was part of a wider effort to provide the apprentices with an understanding of the energy sector, including solar. Since they began their programme they have visited bpTT's Cypre subsea trees and attended the T&T Energy Conference.

The apprentices have almost completed the first phase of the programme and will then start training in preparation for deployment at bpTT's operating facilities.
