# MIPED: The \$150 million mark

**In January, bpTT’s Mayaro Initiative for Private Enterprise Development (MIPED), celebrated its milestone achievement of \$150 million (TT) in loans disbursed since its inception in 2002.**

This programme provides microfinance loan facilities, targeting residents of Mayaro & environs who are unable to secure loans from traditional financial institutions. These loans are intended to enable entrepreneurship across industries such as fishing, agriculture, food, services, retail, vehicles and tourism.







## Ginger project sanctioned

The MIC students had the opportunity to increase their exposure to the energy sector, when they attended the 3rd day of the 2025 T&T Energy Conference in February. At the conference, they interacted with David Campbell, bpTT's president as well as bpTT staff, before taking part in a career session. This outing followed their visit to bpTT's Cypre project base at the Tembladora facility in December. During their visit to Tembladora, they learnt about the Cypre subsea trees and how these fit into bpTT's operations. Among the trainees are five young persons from Mayaro, Guayaguayare and environs.



The bpTT-MIC Apprenticeship programme began in September and will involve one year of classroom learning, followed by deployment to bpTT's operating sites.
